

## **The Best Trout Spinning Reels of 2023**

(adapted from Field and Stream)

Good trout spinning reels can make all the difference between landing a bunch of fish or a frustrating day on the water. Finicky trout call for a light line and a smooth drag that fights fish without breaking them off. The flashy lures and different baits are eye-catching, but won't do you any good if you can't land fish. If you've been losing too many fish over the last few seasons, it might be time to upgrade.

Reels with low start-up inertia, smooth drags, and small sizes are all key to finding a good balance with ultralight rods. You want something light enough that you can still feel subtle strikes but strong enough to handle a big fish. Finding the best of both worlds can be tricky. Here are Field and Stream's pick of some of the best trout spinning reels on the market.
